EARLY CAREER PROGRAMS

UNDERGRADUATE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Leed undergraduates are given an accelerated opportunity to gain practical experience and insight into working on civil infrastructure projects during their internship placements.

Summer and Winter placements are available with durations of 4, 6 and 12 weeks. This unique experience affords students the opportunity to envision what a career can look like after studies and get a head start in securing employment in the industry.

During this program, students will:

- Contribute to meaningful and structured projects
- Translate the skills, knowledge and theory gained at university into professional practice
- Contribute to problem-solving
- Consolidate their project planning and management skills
- Advance their professional skills, including communication, time management and teamwork

ELIGIBILITY

Our programs are open to students studying in the relevant fields of Engineering (civil, structural and mechanical). New graduates and undergraduates will experience all aspects of project delivery (stakeholder engagement, client communications, quality assurance, project management and subcontractor management, among other areas) providing them with a well-rounded skillset.

We are looking for ambitious second, penultimate and final year students who want to gain industry experience and learn from talented, like-minded professionals who are invested in your development.

All applicants must:

- Have completed, or are expecting to complete a bachelor's degree or higher in a relevant discipline, in time for the next Graduate Program.

OR

- Be enrolled and undertaking studies in a Bachelor Degree in a relevant discipline, in second or penultimate year.
- Hold a current Australian driver's licence (full or probationary).
- Be willing to undergo pre-employment checks (including fitness for duty, national criminal history check).
- Be able to provide evidence of full working rights in Australia. See FAQs regarding international students.

Unfortunately we do not accept first year students due to the nature of the work that is required for the undergraduate role. You will need to have acquired the foundational competencies covered in first year. Please keep your eye on the vacancies page, we look forward to speaking to you next year!

APPLICATION PROCESS

Expressions of Interests are open in Feb/March and Jun/Jul every year. Our general process for Programs Recruitment is below. Timeframes may differ slightly from year to year (our website will be updated to include key dates when confirmed).

1. APPLICATION SUBMISSION

Submit your expression of interest through the careers portal with CV, cover letter and academic transcript.



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2. SHORTLISTING

Our recruitment team will contact shortlisted applicants to conduct an initial phone screening to verify your application.

3. INTERVIEWS



You may be invited to a first interview with hiring managers for Graduate and Undergraduate roles. This is a two-way conversation, you will be encouraged to ask us any questions you have.

In some instances, you may be invited to a second interview if requested by the Hiring Panel.

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4. REFERENCE CHECKS

We contact at least two references to ask final questions.

5. SELECTION AND OFFERS



Successful applicants will be contacted to make a formal offer of employment finalising your place in our next intake. We will prepare all required checks such as pre-employment, medical and criminal history checks to be completed prior to your official start date.

FAQs

What projects will I be working on?

The project location assigned will depend on the projects available at the time of your placement.

Our projects are located across metropolitan, regional and remote locations. Many of our projects are in regional or remote areas of Australia, and you may be required to travel interstate on a DIDO or FIFO arrangement.

What opportunities are available beyond my internship/program?

You may be considered for employment in our Graduate Program upon completing your internship placement. Graduates are employed on an ongoing basis.

Is this an office-based role?

No. Graduate and Undergraduate roles are based on construction sites.

Are opportunities open to international students?

The program requires applicants to hold full working rights in Australia. This means any applicants holding a visa that restricts their capacity to work full time in Australia, for at least two years, are not eligible.

Will I be doing manual labour?

Generally, we do not expect Undergraduates or Graduates to complete tasks that require any manual labour or trade work. However, you may from time to time be required to undertake general tasks.

What amenities are available on sites?

Available amenities include lunchrooms, drinking water stations, site offices, meetings spaces and access to bathrooms for female, male and unisex genders.

What kind of questions do you ask applicants at interview?

We will ask you questions about your experiences (study or work related), your interests that led you to apply and what attributes make you a great team member. We encourage you to ask us questions too!
